President's Report

Welcome everyone to the Annual Report for the Ainslie Park Cricket Club for Season 2024 / 25.

Each Summer our club brings together hundreds of families, individuals, current players, supporters and past members. From kids and their parents just starting out, through to our club legends, some of which are in their 7th decade of club cricket. Our sport is unique in how it brings together such a large variety of ages and abilities, men and women, the serious and those just wanting some fun and then throws them together in a team environment. Not only does this allow for such scenarios as Grandparents playing with their Grandkids and Dads with their Sons & Daughters, but this year we also had club legend Dereck Guye get to watch his 3 sons and 2 of his Grandkids all win a match together.

This coming together also extends off the field. I love that we now regularly have multiple tables of Juniors at the Thursday night dinner, that our Women's team has created a 'Ladies' stand for Saturdays and that the men reciprocate and turn up in numbers to support the Women on a Sunday.

As we're about to enter our 50th season, clubs like ours, and community cricket in general have never faced more challenges. We're all busier, with our members enjoying many more competing interests, costs and fees are always increasing and clubs are significantly more complex to run with increasing requirements from council and organising bodies and the club now operates 6 days a week for 6 months of the year. All of this with the same size committee the club has had for over 40 years. This coming season we will be asking for more help to share the load. This is vital so our amazing volunteers don't burn out and we can keep providing the type of experience we currently enjoy for many more seasons.

We've had so much to celebrate this season – 11 sides making the finals and premierships to our

16/1s and 4th XI, our Senior T20 side winning the entire tournament from over 40 clubs, our women's team making the Grand Final for the 2nd year in a row. Our Stage 1 girls and senior 3rd XI also took it all the way to the grand final, unfortunately missing out after great seasons. Off the field, we've had some incredible social functions including that huge country and western night, plenty of tasty Thursday night meals and weekend breakfasts with the best coffee in the RDCA.

Next season is the clubs 50th, something we will celebrate in multiple ways including a gala dinner and season launch. We will be looking to continue expanding our Women's and Girls programs, with extra investment in coaching and hopefully more teams. This season our Women played as Ainslie Park, not Ainslie Ranges for the first time, and from next season I'm proud to say our girls will also be playing as Ainslie Park as well.

From an investment point of view, we are hoping to replace the centre wicket, repair and modernise the nets, improve the honour board situation in rooms and hopefully get a split system in the kitchen. We are also aiming to significantly increase our investment in coaching and development throughout the whole club – from our Blasters, through Juniors, Mens, Womens and even the Vets if there's still something to teach the old dogs!

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the following people. First of all, our Executive Committee.

Alan Moss – As secretary easily the hardest and busiest job in any club, Mossy manages to do it effortlessly without ever getting flustered and all between rounds of golf and power walks. In addition, he does a heap of extra work around the club, especially on match day and getting rooms ready and packed up at either end of the season. On top of this

Treasurer's Report

The club recorded a trading surplus of \$5,702 for the 2024/25 season — an improvement of \$3,761 on last season. Our true net cash position, adjusted for amounts held on trust, receivables, payables, and accruals, increased by \$17,511 as at 30 April 2025.

This was the first season the club was required to register for GST. Aside from sponsorship the committee chose not to increase prices to cover this and so turnover and profit reduced as a result.

An unexpected bonus was the T20 Senior Premiership which saw the club collect a \$6,000 winners cheque. Thank you to the T20 squad for their hard work which the club rewarded with bar credits and complimentary tickets to presentation night.

Bar, Canteen and Social

Profits from the bar, canteen, and social events were significantly down on last season. Some of this is due to increased costs of food and drink which we absorbed at the counter. Other reasons for a net reduction were no reunion this season, always a high turnover event. The club also covered Presentation Night tickets for the winning T20 squad and drinks for Grand Final teams.

There is a definite rebalancing of the types and time of sales, with more canteen and less bar becoming the norm. Thursday night has become a more consistent and reliable social evening than Saturday's which has seen a significant reduction in bar sales.

Thank you to Kim Lamont and her band of helpers for again managing our social calendar. Thank you to Trent and Ethan on the bar and to Matt for managing the canteen along with many other helpers.

Sponsorship

General sponsorship fell, a not unexpected result given tougher conditions for small businesses who represent our sponsorship base. This was somewhat offset by increases on the player sponsorship side.

Sponsorship remains crucial to meeting our day-to-day operating costs and is a whole of club effort.

Thanks must go to Rick Forster, Alan Moss, and Jason Eaton for managing the general sponsorship program. Thank you to Leigh Jones and players who attracted a player sponsor for continuing to grow the program.

Membership Fees

Player membership fees dropped this year due to a smaller senior player base, with more juniors who don't pay senior fees playing Saturday afternoons. A greater share of senior players took up the weekly payer program, something I only see growing in future.

The social membership program was reintroduced helping balance total membership fees to last season. Some work is needed to ensure this represents value for members next season.

Fundraising

Fundraising activity was down again this season. We only ran one Bunnings BBQ again, thank you to Jo Walton for tackling this important job. Ladies day saw a good turnout but much lower funds raised than last season, a great effort nonetheless and the club contributed \$500 in donations from reserves for this worthy cause.

We received grants from Cricket Australia and Maroondah Council for the nets surface upgrade, such that there was no cost to the club.

Thank you to Brendan McGuiness for running the fantasy competition again, which nets a small profit.

Clothing

Max Moss continues to do a wonderful job with our clothing. We again cleared old stock at heavy discounts but were able to turn a small profit. We are

still carrying old supplier stock which will have to be cleared next season. Quality issues from last season seem to be behind us now but lead times for in season orders are still a challenge.

Operating Costs

Administration and playing costs were again tightly managed. Adjusted for capital expenditure (covered by aforementioned grants) administration costs were significantly reduced. Playing costs were on par with last season.

Financial Position

Our balance sheet remains very healthy with significant cash reserves and only minor liabilities. We build up these reserves so we can continue to invest in our player programs and facilities.

The committee remains committed to investing in junior development and continuing to strengthen our senior playing group, both come with their challenges and we ask for patience as we attack both head on.

We expect that investments in the centre wicket and nets at Ainslie Park will impact cash reserves next season but bring great benefit to all players.

To our entire committee and all club members — your contributions, both formal and informal, are what make this club so special.

And to my wife Andrea, thank you for your support, both as a player and as Treasurer.

Financial Report Notes

These notes are provided in the interest of clarifying key aspects of the Ainslie Park Cricket Club Financial Report for the year ended 30 April 2025.

Notes are only provided where there is a change in income or expenditure from the previous financial year that is sufficient to warrant explanation. All figures are adjusted for GST:

- Bar/canteen and social event gross profit fell by 31% (~\$15,200) due to a decrease in social functions, increases in all food and drink costs and comping drinks and presentation night tickets for Grand Final teams.
- Clothing saw a major improvement with the line profitable again ~(\$600) even after clearing some old stock at a heavy discount. There remains old stock that will likely be cleared next year at a discount.
- 3. Fundraising was up 280% (~\$19,300) due to grants received for the nets surface replacement.
- 4. Membership was up 8% (~\$2,400) due to the reintroduced social membership (~\$3,000) which was reduced by fewer player fees (~\$600) due to a reduction in full fee paying senior players.
- 5. Sponsorship was down 2% (~\$800) due to decreased general sponsorship (~\$3,200) but offset by an improvement in the player sponsor program (~\$2,400).
- 6. Other income (excluding recoveries from ERJFC) increased by 439% (~\$7,400) due to T20 winnings (~\$6,000) and increases in interest on savings and term deposits (~\$800).
- Capital expenditure increased by 187%
 (~\$15,400) due to the nets resurfacing.
- 8. Light, power and heating decreased by 23% (~\$2,000) due to a decrease in rates and usage.

- Non playing equipment decreased by 30% (~\$1,400) with investments in POS, scoreboard laptop, internet and BBQ.
- 10. Cricket ball costs increased by 40% (~\$2,300) due to an increase in per ball costs.
- 11. Playing equipment decreased by 96% (~\$4,300) with no major purchases.
- 12. Matchday streaming (~\$1,700) has been separately itemised for the first time and includes platform costs, internet and the purchase of a new camera.
- 13. Afternoon teas increased by 115% (~\$1,500) due to an increase in food prices and more reimbursements made to club volunteers.
- 14. Training expenses increased by 37% (~\$2,700) due to increased investment in school programs delivered by SEDA.
- 15. The nets redevelopment as per previous seasons continues to be depreciated on a straight line basis of \$8,000 per annum.

Coach's Report

At Ainslie Park, we continue to pride ourselves on punching above our weight as a club, and this season was no different. We put in some hard yards in the preseason, starting in July with our Development Squad and finishing with a couple of strong practice match performances. We had a few more players committing to weekend sessions of fielding and conditioning which was great to see, but we'd always love to see even more next preseason.

For a club of our size, we've also gone above and beyond to give back to the community, working with the Glenallen School for more than a decade. This was an area that we slipped a little bit in the previous season with fewer numbers attending the annual working bee. We called for a reaction to that and we got it, which was pleasing to see. We got back up to the attendance we expect when we're putting others before ourselves and pitching in to help the less fortunate. Thanks to those who attended the Glenallen working bee this season. It's an important part of who we are and what we're about.

We've produced another season with widespread success stories. The 4th XI premiership, 5 out of 6 teams in finals, Grand Final appearances from the Women's XI and the 3rds. Although we'd love to win every grade we compete in, success comes in many forms. Our women's program is two seasons in and has seen two grand finals, Jimmy Johnstone debuted in the 1s and played every game, young Xavier Walles took out the Bolt Medal, more young players filtered up the grades and played key roles. All really important measures of success.

Adding to a bit of a mixed bag, at the other end of the scale, the 1st XI managed to fight their way out of a relegation battle. As grim as that may sound, from top to bottom it was the tightest and most hotly contested Trollope Shield season we've ever seen, and shows what kind of challenge they face every single game. The last month of the season galvanised

the group and highlighted what our 1sts are still capable of, and we'll be doing whatever we can to bring those types of performances more consistently.

The Women's 1st XI had a consistent season, back to back Grand Final appearances and another season full of development across all players. Well done ladies! I have been so impressed, although not surprised with the improvement in our girls' skills and knowledge of the game. I'm not surprised because they always ask questions, all want to learn and all chip in to help their teammates improve. We couldn't ask for better attitudes towards their team and the club to inspire the next generation. Well done to Georgia in her first year of captaincy, and a big thank you to Pieter van der Berg for leading the Women's Program development and providing the women's team with a dedicated coaching resource.

Our 2nds started strongly, winning 6 of the first 8 games in an impressive show of our depth. Whilst we never want to make excuses, I think some of the momentum loss in the second half was due to the important players missing from that team. Cam Eustice (injury) and Lewis Davison (up to the 1s) were big losses in particular. We remain committed to filtering as much youth as possible into the 2s, and the fact we have the depth to do that allows us to look to the future with optimism. Taj, JC and Lith all had great seasons, with all the young 2s guys learning a lot playing with and against quality players in that grade every week. A big thanks and congratulations to Josh White for navigating his first season of captaincy.

Another big year for the 3rds as they got very close to a back to back season. A measure of our success as a club is seeing our juniors transition into seniors, then progress through the grades, and the 3rd XI this season has definitely been witness to that. We saw our juniors like Xavier Walles, Jobe Walton and Blake Gregson taking huge strides in the 3rds this season,

and Kento Inoue getting a taste of some higher cricket in the 3s. Thank you to Matty Barr who has done a brilliant job in managing the toughest team to captain.

It feels like a case of another season, another 4th XI premiership! Col Guye is an outstanding leader, so it was no surprise that the 4ths had a great year. Thanks Col for always thinking of our youth and the future of the club. It was great to see more young talent shining in this grade, with Kento second on the wickets tally, and Archer Croot gaining some valuable experience. These young players are learning from experienced heads like Troy, Nugget, Kieran and Hayden who led the way, so the premiership was a great reward for a bunch of players who all create a great environment for each other.

The 5ths finished 2nd in a tight grade. Gaz again led the troops, managing the mix of experience and youth well. The theme of more young players continued in the 5ths with Archer Croot, Jack Simpson, Benny Walles, Xavier and Jas Freeman, Jarrod Crowe, Rob Stacey, Marek Rainczuk, Jayden Bullen and Chelsea Thomas all making appearances, as well as a few mentioned further up that went through the 5s and played higher. Thanks to the experienced seniors in this team who have welcomed these kids into senior cricket, that's what it's all about, and I hope to see all of them progress through the grades in years to come.

Thanks to Rowan for managing the Development Squad and strength and conditioning again, and helping with general coaching duties. He helped out when I couldn't be there as well and that is much appreciated. Spreading the coaching load is one of the main areas we'll see improvement next season. A subcommittee has already been working to appoint a broad and sustainable structure of coaching that covers all aspects of skills, as well as leadership, player welfare, development and more. The feedback

we often hear is that more players want access to more coaching, more often. We hear that, and we will be providing an exciting panel of coaching that will be accessible to the whole club, filled with names that you see filling our honour boards. I can't wait to see it in action.

A shout out to the committee who remained nothing but supportive. I appreciate the chats, check ins and everything else, over and above the hours that you all put into the club amongst busy lives. Thanks to our scorers Stu and Sue, our dinner organisers Troy and Jo, barmen Ship and Ethan, fantasy league manager BJ, and all of our other volunteers and supporters. A big thanks to Nicole who always supports me in putting in the time for the club.

It is and always will be the people that make the club, and that's why we'll go into our 50th season in great shape, because great people make it tick. See you all next season.
